



Illegal dumping

Placing unaccepted items on the naturestrip and placing items out too early is considered as illegal dumping and a penalty up to \$10,000 may apply.

Presenting Your Collection Correctly

Please contact your building manager directly before placing materials out for collection.

Contact:

① Place hard waste out on time

Neatly place acceptable items on the approved location the weekend before your collection week (by 6am Monday morning for collection during that week).

② Present your materials correctly

Location:

Only place accepted items out for collection. Present general waste and scrap metal/electrical items in two separate piles. Check the list opposite or visit our website. Each item must:

- be less than 1.5 metres in length (excluding some furniture items and items with smaller limits)
- be easily lifted by two people
- must not exceed the buildings size allowance.

③ Remove uncollected materials

Incorrect items will not be collected and must be removed from the nature strip within 24 hours of collection or you risk receiving a fine.



Accepted collection – guide only

Don't exceed the allocated amount

If you place items that exceed your buildings allocation it will not be collected and items may be considered as illegal dumping.

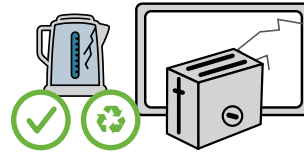

Important: Refer to your building manager for item limits



Scrap metal, small car parts and lawn mowers, bikes, empty paint tins (lids removed)



Electronic appliances (any item with a plug, battery or cord), all batteries must be removed



Timber (no longer than 1.5m)



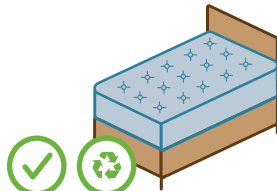
Tree branches and prunings – bundled and tied with string or twine. Branches must be less than 7.5cm wide and 1.5m long. Bundles must be smaller than 30cm wide



Hot water systems (empty water and max weight 55kgs)



White goods including washing machines, stoves and fridges with doors removed or taped shut



Mattresses and bed bases



Furniture

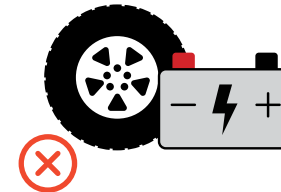


Carpet rolled and tied (no wider than 1.5m and able to be carried by 1 person)



Glass items, ceramics and crockery (wrapped and labelled 'glass' or 'crockery')

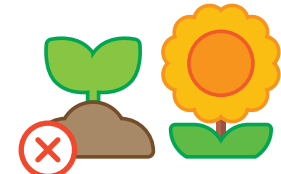

Tyres and car batteries



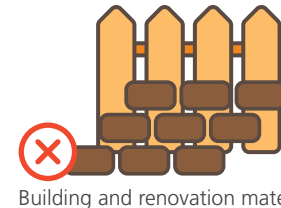
Engine oil and engine blocks



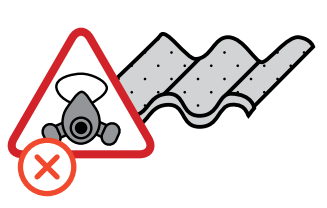
General garden waste (other than branches/prunings), soil or earth



Household waste and recyclables



Building and renovation materials including rubble, cement sheeting or fences



Asbestos and other hazardous waste



Gas cylinders



Household chemicals, paint and pesticides



All material collected including compacted material is taken to a Transfer Station for sorting and recycling. Items may be collected by multiple vehicles.
