What are the Whitehorse Sport and Recreation Awards?

The Whitehorse Sport and Recreation Awards recognise the hard work and dedication of local athletes, sporting clubs, recreational groups, and their volunteers across the City of Whitehorse.

The awards highlight the important contribution local sporting clubs and recreational groups make to the community and the outstanding achievements of their members. They also acknowledge excellence in club management and the behind-the-scenes efforts of volunteers.

Categories:

There are 13 award categories of awards that you can nominate a club, group, team or individual for, including:

- Participant of the Year a person over the age of 18, with outstanding sport and recreation achievements, demonstrated sportsmanship and given back to the community.
- Junior Participant of the Year (under age 18 as at 1 July 2024) a person under age of 18, with outstanding sport and recreation achievements, demonstrated sportsmanship and given back to the community
- Participant of the Year with a Disability– a person who has a disability with outstanding sport and recreation achievements, demonstrated sportsmanship and given back to the community.
- Masters Participant of the Year a person who participates in the master's section as defined by their activities' guidelines or are aged over 40 as of 1 July 2025. With outstanding sport and recreation achievements, demonstrated sportsmanship and given back to the community
- Team of the Year This category is open to a team or defined section who participate in a sport, recreation or leisure activity, with outstanding sport and recreation achievements not the whole club.
- Official of the Year A person who officiates a sporting or recreational event. Such as umpires and referees etc.
- Volunteer of the Year A person over the age of 18, who provides a service to a club/group/activity for which they are not paid. Volunteers can include committee members, group leaders, etc.
- Junior Volunteer of the Year (under age 18 as at 1 July 2025) A person under 18, who provides a service to a club/group/activity for which they are not paid. Volunteers can include committee members, group leaders, etc.
- Coach/Leader of the Year A person who is in a position of leading a team or group in a non-participating capacity, without remuneration. Examples can include a sporting team coach or a Scout/Guide section leader.
- Sports Club of the Year a club who participates in an <u>organised sporting activity</u> within the City of Whitehorse with outstanding on and off field achievements.
- Women in Community Leadership Award A female volunteer (not paid) who has made a significant contribution in the local sport, recreation and leisure industry whilst holding a position of leadership such as president, coach, leader or official.
- Recreation Group of the Year a group or club who participate in an activity which is **NOT** classified as organised sport. Examples include Scouts, Guides, Model Boat.

• Sport and Recreation Initiative of the Year - Initiatives are deliberate activities that achieve positive outcomes for the Whitehorse community through sport and recreation. Initiatives may encourage participation in a sport or activity to a person or persons who traditionally do not participate, support community members to connect with each other, raise awareness for important causes or promote healthy lifestyles for individuals.

How to nominate:

Nominations can be submitted via <u>https://www.whitehorse.vic.gov.au/about-</u> <u>council/what-we-do/awards-grants-and-funding/whitehorse-sports-awards</u>. Select criteria which best reflects the work of the club/group/person you wish to nominate and then complete the questions before submitting. Applications must be received by <u>11.59pm on Sunday 10 August 2025</u> – no late nominations will be considered.

Eligibility for awards:

Eligibility for each award is as follows:

- Any club or team nomination the club/group must be a not-for profit organisation with the City of Whitehorse.
- Individuals nominated must live or be a member of a sport, recreational or leisure group based within the City of Whitehorse.

To submit an application, you will need to provide:

- Nominators (Your) Name
- Nominators (Your) Email address
- Nominee's Name (and carer/guardian if nominee is under 18)
- Nominee's Email address (and carer/guardian if nominee is under 18)
- Responses to the relevant criteria for the chosen category
- A photo of the nominee (with relevant permissions)

Pages 4 to 10 outlines the exact questions asked for each award category to assist nominators when submitting a nomination.

How are nominations assessed:

The Whitehorse Sport and Recreation Awards are assessed by the Whitehorse Sport and Recreation Reference Group (WSRRG). The WSRRG consists of 10 elected community members and two Councillors. Officers from Leisure and Recreation Services Department assist with the administration of the group and the awards.

Each member of the WSRRG award a score out of 10 for each of the questions in the category per nominee. Each nominee's scores are accumulated with the person, team or group with the highest score being name the recipient of that category award. There can be more than one winner per category.

Council officers do not participate in the voting of nominations. Any member of the WSRRG (community member or Councillor) who has a conflict of interest with a nominee are excluded from voting in that category.

Participant of the Year

This category is open to any person <u>who lives or participates</u> in a sport, recreation or leisure activity within the City of Whitehorse. As there is a junior participant category, we recommend nominee's is this category be aged over 18 as of 1 July 2025.

Outline the nominee's outstanding sport and recreation achievements from 1 July 2024 until 30 June 2025? Include as much detailed information as possible on the nominee's achievements. This specifically refers to on field or active achievements the person has made over the past 12 months. Mention any other awards or nominations the person may have received.

Junior Participant of the Year (under 18 years)

This category is open to any person who <u>lives or participates</u> in a sport, recreation or leisure activity within the City of Whitehorse. The individual should be aged under 18 as of 1 July 2025.

Outline the nominee's outstanding sport and recreation achievements from 1 July 2024 until 30 June 2025? Include as much detailed information as possible on the nominee's achievements. This specifically refers to on field or active achievements the person has made over the past 12 months. Mention any other awards or nominations the person may have received.

Participant of the Year with a Disability

This category is open to any person with a disability who <u>lives or participates</u> in a sport, recreation or leisure activity within the City of Whitehorse.

Masters Participant of the Year (New category in 2025)

This category is open to any person who <u>lives or participates</u> in a sport, recreation or leisure activity within the City of Whitehorse. Nominees participate in the master's section as defined by their activities' guidelines or are aged over 40 as of 1 July 2025.

Outline the nominee's outstanding sport and recreation achievements from 1 July 2024 until 30 June 2025? Include as much detailed information as possible on the nominee's achievements. This specifically refers to on field or active achievements the person has made over the past 12 months. Mention any other awards or nominations the person may have received.

Team of the Year

This category is open to any team or defined section who participate in a sport, recreation or leisure activity within the City of Whitehorse. Teams can include the boys under 14a basketball team or master's women's football team at your sporting club or a category / section of participants in a recreation group such as the Rover Scouts (18-25yo) etc. It is one team / section within a club which has had a significant achievement in the past 12 months, not the whole club.

Official of the Year

This category is open to any person who lives or officiates in a sport, recreation or leisure activity within the City of Whitehorse. A person who officiates a sporting or recreational event. Such as umpires and referees etc.

Volunteers can include committee members, group leaders, etc. As there is a junior volunteer category, we recommend nominee's is this category be aged over 18 as of 1 July 2025.

How has the nominee performed their role with excellence from 1 July 2024 until 30 June 2025? Include as much detailed information as possible on the role/s and service the person provides to the club/group/activity, including any other awards or nominations they may have received.

How has the nominee fulfilled their responsibilities with enthusiasm, professionalism and fairness? *Include examples of these traits in the context of their voluntary role.*

Junior Volunteer of the Year (under 18)

This category is open to any person who lives or volunteers in a sport, recreation or leisure activity within the City of Whitehorse. A volunteer is a person who provides a service to a club/group/activity for which they are not paid. Volunteers can include committee members, group leaders, etc. In this category, individuals must be under age of 18 as of 1 July 2025.

How has the nominee performed their role with excellence from 1 July 2024 until 30 June 2025? Include as much information as possible on the service and the role/s the person provides to the club/group/activity, including any other awards or nominations they have received.

How has the nominee fulfilled their responsibilities with enthusiasm, professionalism and fairness? Include examples of how of these traits in the context of their voluntary role.

Coach/Leader of the Year

This category is open to any person who lives or volunteers in a sport, recreation or leisure activity within the City of Whitehorse. A Coach/Leader is a person who is in a position of leading a team or group in a non-participating capacity, without remuneration. Examples can include a sporting team coach or a Scout/Guide section leader.

How has the nominee performed their role with excellence from 1 July 2024 until 30 June 2025? Include as much detailed information as possible on the service the person provides to the club/group/activity, including any other awards or nominations they may have received.

How has the nominee demonstrated strong leadership and instilled a positive and inclusive environment within their club/group/activity? Include examples of how they demonstrate these traits in the context of their coach/leader role.

Describe how has the nominee has contributed as a coach/leader to the local sport, recreation or leisure industry and/or local community? *Outline how the nominee has gone over and above their standard responsibilities – examples include training/mentoring other coaches/leaders, giving up time in excess of what's expected of their role.*

2024 Club of the Year

Sports Club of the Year

This category is open to any club who participates in an <u>organised sporting activity</u> within the City of Whitehorse. Examples include a Baseball, Basketball, Cricket or Football Club etc. Non-sporting groups can nominate for Recreation Group of the Year.

Outline the Clubs significant sporting achievements from 1 July 2024 until 30 June 2025 Include as much information on entire club achievements – not just a specific team. Think broader than just premierships consider other 'achievements' the clubs have reached.

Women in Community Leadership Award

This category is open to any person who lives or volunteers within the City of Whitehorse. Nominees are for a female volunteer (not paid) who has made a significant contribution in the local sport, recreation and leisure industry whilst holding a position of leadership such as president, coach, leader or official.

What position of leadership has the nominee held between 1 July 2024 until 30 June

2025 Provide detail on the position of leadership the person holds for which they are being nominated. Also include any information on previous positions held.

How has the nominee played an active role in the development and delivery of programs for the betterment of the club and/or community? Consider whether the nominee has championed change in the club through any new strategies, initiatives or programs.

What are some of the key outcomes that have been achieved because of the nominees work at the club? Provide details on the benefits derived from the nominee's work – this could include increased membership, improved club culture etc. Provide examples.

2024 Recreation Group of the Year

Recreation Group of the Year

This category is open to any group who conducts their activity within the City of Whitehorse. Nominees are to be groups or clubs who participate in an activity which is **NOT** classified as organised sport. Examples include Scouts, Guides, Model Boat.

This category is open to any club/group who conducts their activity within the City of Whitehorse. Initiatives are deliberate activities that achieve positive outcomes for the Whitehorse community through sport and recreation. Initiatives may encourage participation in a sport or activity to a person or persons who traditionally do not participate, support community members to connect with each other, raise awareness for important causes or promote healthy lifestyles for individuals.

Describe the sport, recreation or leisure initiative your group/club delivered between 1 July 2024 until 30 June 2025? Include what was the aim of the initiative, who participated and how it was implemented.
