Mayor's message

Cr Kirsten Langford

What a delight to be writing my first message as Mayor of Whitehorse City Council. It is an honour to be trusted with this role by my fellow Councillors.

As the festive seasons wraps up, I hope you can continue spending precious time with family and friends over the summer months before beginning the back to school rush. I know many people in our community will have worked through the Christmas period to keep businesses running, as they do year-round. I encourage you to shop local and support our small businesses. If you're a small business looking for help this year, please reach out to our newly launched Business Permit Support Service.

Council recently endorsed our position on how we will collect garbage, food organics and garden organics (FOGO) and mixed recycling bins from households. This decision follows significant public consultation where more than 5,500 people shared their views on 2 different service options.

Our community told us how much they rely on a weekly garbage collection. We've listened to this feedback and endorsed the continuation of a weekly



garbage and fortnightly FOGO and mixed recycling service. The Victorian Government requires all households to have a FOGO service and a new glass recycling service in place by 1 July 2027.

Along with 33 other councils, Whitehorse Council is objecting to the requirement for a separate glass service and will review our approach in April. Council continues to advocate for the expansion of the Container Deposit Scheme (CDS) to remove the need for a household glass bin. **Read more on page 4.**



Councillor Committee appointments

At a recent Council Meeting, Councillors were appointed to each of our advisory committees and groups for the coming year.

Advisory committees have been reviewed to align with our Integrated Council Plan 2025-2029 and Community Vision 2040. Newly established committees include the Community Safety Crime Prevention Committee and the Municipal Public Health and Wellbeing Plan (MPHWP) Steering Committee.

All our advisory groups and committees meet regularly throughout the year and are made up of community members, Councillors and council officers.

Each group aims to support decision making and implementation of plans and procedures of Whitehorse City Council in their relevant field.

Council maintains weekly garbage collection

Following community consultation, Council has made a decision about our ongoing kerbside bin services. We adopted Option 1, which means:

- **Garbage bin:** Your garbage bin will stay as a weekly collection, just as it is now.
- **FOGO bin:** Food organics and garden organics (FOGO) bin service will become mandatory for all households that have council bin services from July 2027. This will be collected fortnightly.
- **Mixed recycling bin:** Mixed recycling bin collection will stay fortnightly.
- **Glass recycling bin:** Council has decided to delay making a decision on any glass recycling service model until April 2026.



The Victorian Government requires all councils to move to a 4-bin waste and recycling service by 1 July 2027. We will continue to advocate to the Victorian Government to reconsider the requirement for a separate glass bin, as we know this is an important issue for many residents.

Bin collection calendars for 2026 now available

Keep track of your recycling and food organics and garden organics (FOGO) bin collection schedule with our handy 2026 bin collection calendar.

Garbage bins (red or dark green lid) are collected weekly, while recycling (yellow lid) and FOGO (bright green lid) bins are collected fortnightly on alternate schedules, depending on which zone your house is in.

Staying safe around water

As the weather warms up, many people will enjoy local pools, beaches and backyard swimming. Water activities are fun, but it's important to stay safe.

- Whenever possible, swim at beaches patrolled by lifesavers and stay between the red and yellow flags.
- The **Beachsafe app** can help you find patrolled beaches, check weather conditions, and see hazard ratings. If a beach is rated 8 or above, it isn't safe for most swimmers.
- You should also download and check the **VicEmergency app** for beach closures or warnings and visit **bom.gov.au** to see if strong winds or sudden changes are expected.
- Wearing bright or neon swimwear makes swimmers easier to see underwater. Children should always be supervised; adults should be in the water and within arm's reach with kids under 5 years old and actively watching those aged 5 to 9. Ensure you are not distracted by phones and technology and always follow lifeguard instructions.
- Walk instead of running near water, avoid diving into shallow areas, and know your limits. Take breaks, stay hydrated and do not swim if you feel tired, unwell or if conditions look unsafe.

Strong swimming skills help keep everyone safe. Visit **aqualink.com.au** and search 'learn to swim' to find swimming lessons at Aqualink Box Hill and Aqualink Nunawading.

Extreme heat

Extreme heat can pose serious health risks to your community, so it is important that you keep yourself and your family safe while also checking on people you know who could be vulnerable.

The risk of bushfires also increases during the drier, hotter summer months, so make sure you also have your own emergency plan prepared.

Download the **VicEmergency app** now to receive critical notifications throughout summer, including extreme heat warnings, fire danger ratings, and total fire ban days. The app provides real-time alerts from fire and emergency authorities, helping you stay informed and act quickly to protect yourself and your loved ones.

Stay cool for less

Here are some simple and low-cost tips for a cooler home while saving on your energy bills.

- **Seal any gaps** – Stop hot air getting in your home through gaps.
- **Create a cool room** – Focus on keeping one room cool to save money. Set your air-con to 26°C to reduce energy use.
- **Use the microwave instead of an oven** – Microwaves direct most of their energy into the food. That means you'll stay more comfortable and use less energy while removing cooking heat from your home.






