What is the Whitehorse MEGAmile & Blackburn Activity Centres UDF?

The preparation of an Urban Design Framework [UDF] for the Whitehorse MEGAmile [West] and Blackburn Activity Centres

commenced in June 2009. The project was initiated to guide change and development in the study area for the next 15 years. A Structure Plan for the eastern portion of the 'Mega Mile' (Nunawading and Mitcham Activity Centres) was prepared last year.

The Draft Urban Design Framework will be placed on public display in early 2010 where you will have the opportunity to review the Draft Framework and give your feedback. After display of the Draft and review of feedback, a final version will be prepared for consideration by Council.

WHAT YOU SAID

- Blackburn Activity Centre boundaries need to be defined
- The real Megamile starts at the service roads
- Whitehorse Road at Blackburn is a separate node
- Blackburn Village has a separate & special character which should be protected and strengthened
- Limit the 'creep' of commercial uses into residential areas
- Need to improve north-south connections
- All development should provide adequate car parking
- The industrial area provides an important context
- Integrate sustainability principles into the project
- Limit building height to 2-3 storeys in sensitive locations
- Enhance the 'green' character of the Study Area
- Make better use of existing open spaces
- Improve bicycle & pedestrian networks as a priority for movement in the Study Area
- Plan for the impact of transport projects
- Reduce car dependency
