What is the Whitehorse MEGAmile & Blackburn Activity Centres UDF?

The MEGAmile has been the recent focus of substantial streetscape and parking improvements and is recognised as one of the key destinations for bulky goods retailing in metropolitan Melbourne. Recent and proposed transport changes in the area (including Eastlink, grade separation of the rail line at Springvale Road and provision for a possible third railway line between Box Hill and Ringwood) will increase the potential of the area.


The City of Whitehorse has commenced preparation of the Whitehorse MEGAmile [West] and Blackburn Activity Centres

Urban Design Framework [UDF] to guide change and development in the study area for the next 15 years. The project will complement the existing Structure Plan for the eastern portion of the MEGAmile adopted by Council last year and review the existing planning policies for Blackburn Activity Centre.

The UDF will investigate the opportunities and constraints of the study area and with the community's help, establish design guidelines and strategic directions for both the MEGAmile and Blackburn Activity Centre.

Study Area

The Study Area is shown on the map below. Whilst recommendations of the study will generally be restricted to commercially zoned properties, it is important to understand any potential impacts upon residential properties, hence their inclusion in the study area.
