- 5. If the Responsible Authority refuses the application, the applicant can also seek a review of the decision.

Objections/submissions to a planning application are public documents. Any objection/submission will be available at the Civic Centre office for any person to inspect and copies may be made available on request to any person until the end of the period during which an application for review of a decision on the application may be made or the Victorian Civil and Administrative Tribunal determines the application.
