

Mayor's message Cr Andrew Davenport

I'm pleased to share that on Monday 16 June, Council adopted our Budget 2025/26 and Integrated Council Plan 2025-2029, marking the beginning of a new journey shaped by fresh ideas and renewed purpose. These documents demonstrate Council's strong commitment to listening to our community and doing things differently.

Earlier this year Council shared our Proposed Budget 2025/26 and Proposed Revenue and Rating Plan with the community. Thanks to everyone who took the time to share your thoughts, this feedback helps shape Council decisions and ensures we're on the right track. Whitehorse Councillors and I are currently focused on meeting regularly with your representatives from the other levels of government so we can better serve the community and streamline processes wherever possible. We recently met with Federal Government representatives Gabriel Ng (Member



for Menzies) and Matt Gregg (Member for Deakin) to thank them and Carina Garland (Member for Chisholm) for their election commitments to Whitehorse.

I also recently met with the Deputy Premier's Chief of Staff to discuss how we can help unlock school sports facilities on the weekends and in the evenings to cater to the overwhelming demand for ovals in Whitehorse. This process can be lengthy but we are all committed to making the process faster, so teams have space to train and play.

Integrated Council Plan 2025-2029

Our Integrated Council Plan 2025-2029 is a shared roadmap for the future and will guide our program of work for the next 4 years. It represents a new direction for Council as we embrace change and seek to create a resilient and future-ready organisation. Through the implementation of our Integrated Council Plan, we aim to create a city where everyone can live, work, learn and thrive.

The Integrated Council Plan is built around 5 new Strategic Directions.

Community:

We aim to foster a connected, inclusive, safe and active community where everyone feels a sense of belonging.

Built:

We are aspiring to develop safe, accessible and attractive public spaces and infrastructure that meet community needs and adapt to growth.

Economy:

We are prioritising a resilient and dynamic economy, with support for local businesses, diverse opportunities, and job and investment attraction.

Natural:

We are committed to protecting natural areas, promoting environmental sustainability, building climate resilience, and managing waste responsibly.

Governance:

Strong governance will be achieved through transparent, accountable management and the efficient and financially sustainable delivery of valuable core services.

Council Budget 2025/26

The 2025/26 Budget outlines the services, initiatives and extensive Capital Works Program that Council plans to deliver in the coming financial year. The Budget also details the funding and resources required to deliver the actions outlined in the Integrated Council Plan.

Highlights of our 2025/26 Budget

\$53.1 million Capital Works Program including:

- \$20.8m for land, buildings and building improvements
- \$7.1m for plant and equipment
- \$7.5m for roads and off-street car parks
- \$6.5m for recreational, leisure and community facilities
- \$5.1m for footpaths and cycleways

Capital Works highlights include:

- A significant investment in Box Hill City Oval, including \$8.0m to begin a major redevelopment of the ground's pavilions and buildings, \$3.4m for the renewal of the playing surface, plus \$0.9m for upgrades to the cricket training nets
- \$4.3m to continue the Vermont Reserve pavilion upgrade
- \$0.3m on cycling and active transport infrastructure improvements

This year's operational budget provides \$187.5 million for the delivery of services, including \$26.3 million for Kerbside and Public Waste Services, \$12.7 million for health and family services, and \$10.3 million for community safety.

Other significant operational initiatives for 2025/26 include:

- Creation of a Community Safety Crime Prevention committee to help address community safety concerns and create a safe environment
- Development of a Whitehorse Integrated Transport Strategy (including walking and cycling) to guide Council in delivering advocacy, programs and services
- Development of a Master Plan for Koonung Park to guide its renewal and improvements over the next 15 years

- Completion of a technical and feasibility study on options for a dog park within the municipality
- Continued advocacy for improved open spaces for the community
- Working with the State Government to monitor and provide strong support for businesses, employees and customers displaced and impacted during the Suburban Rail Loop development
- Continuation of the Strategic Property Program to improve the utilisation and management of Council's property portfolio, which will inform community consultation and Council decisions

Young voices, big ideas: Junior Voicenaters help to shape the future of Whitehorse

Whitehorse recognises children as active and engaged community members. As a 'Child Friendly City' we value and respect children's voices.

To provide children in Whitehorse with the opportunity to lend their voices to important Council matters, we have created a Children's Advisory Group.

Named by the members at their inaugural meeting, the 'Junior Voicenaters' is made up of 32 students from 14 primary schools across Whitehorse. The group meets quarterly, providing students with an opportunity to learn about the role of local government, share their perspectives on topics relevant to them, and build their skills and confidence.

Teams within Council can attend these meetings to seek advice and help inform future projects and services. Recently the group members were involved in consulting on a playground masterplan and contributing their ideas for kidfriendly programming at The Round.

A student from Blackburn Primary School said her highlight so far had been "designing a playground. I liked thinking of activities that would be the best for all ages in a playground".

Another student said he had enjoyed "meeting new people and working with them on the activities".




New green space at Hay Street

An old car park at 35 Hay Street in Box Hill South, purchased by Council in 2024, has been transformed into green open parkland. The large bitumen area was removed while the existing mature trees were retained.

There has been extensive planting of indigenous trees and plants to increase biodiversity, support wildlife and expand the Gardiners Creek corridor.

A large open grass area now features seating, a picnic table, and a new gravel path lined with stone blocks links to the Gardiners Creek Trail.

This prominent landmark on Whitehorse Road was built to the design of J.S. Gawler and J.C. Aisbett and was originally opened in 1935 by the City of Box Hill, before the City of Whitehorse was proclaimed in 1994.

The Art Deco Main Hall has hosted thousands of memorable moments over 90 years including weddings, debutante balls, political debates, exhibitions, concerts, theatre productions and even filming for Neighbours, Miss Fisher's Murder Mysteries and other TV shows.

The Town Hall is now registered with the National Trust and remains a core part of community life, With regular events, citizenship ceremonies, the gallery - Whitehorse Artspace and the Community Hub.


