Have your say on our Proposed Budget 2025/26 and Revenue and Rating Plan 2025-2029

Following our major Shaping Whitehorse community consultation in 2024, we have developed our Integrated Council Plan 2025-2029 (includes the Municipal Public Health and Wellbeing Plan).

To help deliver the priorities within our Council Plan we are now seeking community feedback on the Proposed Budget 2025/26 and Proposed Revenue and Rating Plan 2025-2029.



About the Proposed Budget 2025/26

Our Proposed Budget 2025/26 outlines the services, initiatives and extensive capital works program that Council plans to deliver in the coming financial year, as well as the funding and resources required to deliver them.

Importantly, our Proposed Budget demonstrates our commitment to financial sustainability. Inflation and the cost-of-living continue to place pressure on Council operations and our community. In the face of these challenges, our Proposed Budget remains balanced and financially responsible.

Budget snapshot

- \$187 million operational budget to deliver services
- \$53 million capital works budget
- Rate increase of 3% (in line with the State Government's rate cap)

Proposed Budget highlights include:

- \$26.35 million for household bin collections and public waste services.
- \$16.79 million for the maintenance of sports fields, parks and gardens.
- \$15.34 million for leisure and recreation services.
- \$12.73 million for family services and community health.

Capital works highlights include:

- A significant investment in Box Hill City Oval, including \$8 million to begin a major redevelopment of the ground's pavilions and buildings, \$3.4 million for the renewal of the playing surface, plus \$900,000 for upgrades to the cricket training nets.
- \$4.28 million to continue the Vermont Reserve pavilion upgrade.
- \$3.26 million for footpath renewals.
- \$2.67 million for road resurfacing projects.
- \$1.4 million for the renewal and upgrade of playgrounds.

Shaping Whitehorse is about working with our community to plan for the next 4 years and beyond.

Disposing of batteries and e-waste safely

Batteries and e-waste (anything with a battery, plug or a cord) must never be placed in any household bin. Unwanted batteries and e-waste can cause fires, either in the bins or in the trucks that collect them, putting residents and the drivers at risk.

AA batteries and other standard handheld size batteries, 9-volt and button batteries are accepted free of charge at:

- any B-cycle Battery Recycling drop-off points, [bcycle.com.au/drop-off](https://www.bcycle.com.au/drop-off)
- the Recycling Hub at one of our customer service locations
- the Whitehorse Recycling and Waste Centre (also accepts car batteries)

Please follow the instructions on safe battery disposal at these locations.

You can safely dispose of e-waste by:

- booking a free hard waste collection
- dropping e-waste off at the Whitehorse Recycling and Waste Centre free of charge

Stay warm and save this winter

As the weather gets cooler, preparing your home for winter now will help you stay comfortable while reducing energy bills.

Here are some tips to save energy this winter:

Block those draughts: Install weather strips or use door snakes around external doors and windows to prevent up to 25% of your home's heat from escaping through gaps.

Switch to efficient heating: Consider installing and using electric reverse-cycle split systems that use 3-6 times less energy than gas or portable electric heaters.

Use wood heaters responsibly: Maintain and clean your wood heater and flue regularly and use only untreated, dry and seasoned wood. Keep air controls fully open when starting a fire and refuelling, set your vent high enough to keep the fire burning brightly and never let your wood heater smoulder.

Curtain power:

Open curtains during sunny days to capture natural warmth, then close them when the sun sets to trap heat inside. Choose thick, heavy curtains and install pelmets to ensure a snug fit against walls and floors for maximum insulation.



Check out Solar Savers: Solar Savers is a Council-supported program to help improve your energy efficiency with quality heating systems, solar panels, and heat-pump hot water systems, saving you money while keeping warm. They can also help you access government rebates and discounts.

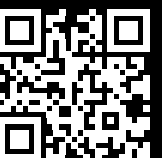


